## The proposed Theodore Wind Farm is progressing in line with our development schedule, with important milestones recently achieved.

A key highlight is the successful finalisation of the project's Public Environment Report (PER), which is now available for public viewing. Community members and stakeholders can access the report from the project website. This is a significant achievement. The PER is critical component of the project's environmental approvals process. Only minor amendments were required after consultation on the draft report in April, with no substantial changes needed.

Further strengthening the project's outlook, the Theodore Wind Farm has secured a contract under the Australian Government's Capacity Investment Scheme. This supports the project's future by establishing a revenue floor and ceiling.

Behind the scenes, the team continues to engage with industry partners. Discussions with Powerlink Queensland about grid connection are progressing well – an important step to integrate the wind farm into the broader energy network.

In team news, we welcome Will Radford as Head of Theodore Wind Farm. Will has been at RWE for 8 years and is experienced in late-stage development. His valuable experience will guide the project through its next phases of development.

We look forward to sharing further updates as the project continues to move ahead.
